Leaves, Grass & Brush

Leaves, grass clippings and brush can be dropped off by residents, municipal collection crews & commercial haulers.

Compost & Mulch

When *in stock*, finished compost & woodchip mulch are available to the public. The SCMUA offers **black & red mulch** at a nominal fee.

Never put rechargeable batteries in recycling or garbage! Bring to a drop-off center.



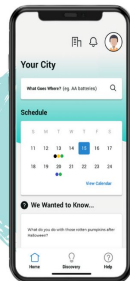

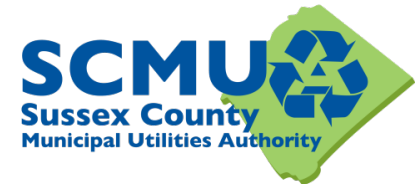

Electronic Waste Days

Saturdays April 27th & Oct. 5th

FREE: Recycle desktop and portable computers, desktop printers, televisions, computer monitors and other personal electronics.

Recycle electronic waste at the Convenience Center any day during normal business hours. TV's, computers, desktop printers and fax machines are **Free** of charge.



Household Hazardous Waste

Saturdays June 1st & Nov. 2nd
Sussex County residents only

Examples: **Lead & oil-based paints, stains, paint thinner, driveway sealer, pesticides, lighter fluid, old gasoline, fuel oils, kerosene, lubricants, pool chemicals, mercury and acids.** No Latex paint or smoke detectors. Dry out latex paint and dispose as regular trash.

FREE: Up to: 100 lbs. dry household hazardous waste, 10 fluorescent bulbs, and/or 10 gal. liquid waste for free. Scale charge for larger quantities.

Recycling Center

The SCMUA Solid Waste Facility provides a comprehensive **Recycling Center** for Sussex County residents **free of charge.**



Mixed Containers

- Glass bottles
- Aluminum, tin & steel cans
- Plastic bottles, jugs & containers #1, #2 & #5



Mixed Fiber

- Office paper
- Junk mail
- Magazines
- Chipboard



Packaging Foam

- #6 Symbol
- No Peanuts
- No food containers

- Plastic Film and Bags** clean, dry, empty
- Cooking Oil**
- Used Motor Oil & Antifreeze** (5-gallon limit per car/per day)
- Clothing & Textiles**
- Cell Phones (For Soldiers)**
- American Flags**
- Rechargeable Household Batteries**



Convenience Center

Dispose of solid waste and recycle bulk items at the **Residents Convenience Center** at a per pound rate. **REMOVE Recyclable, Hazardous or Electronic Waste materials** before disposal. Staff available to assist residents.

Bagged Garbage Area

Disposal Cost: \$0.15/pound (50¢ min scale charge). Check or cash accepted.

Drop-Off Area

SCMUA truck scale \$125/ton (\$0.0625/lb.) \$10 minimum scale charge. Check, cash, MC, Visa & AmEx accepted.

Household Items Accepted

- Bagged Garbage
- Latex (water-based) Paints
- Electronics (TV's/computers/printers are FREE)
- Mattresses & Bedsprings
- Furniture, chairs, couches and tables
- Appliances (microwaves, toaster ovens)
- Refrigerators, air conditioners & water coolers (*\$10 surcharge for Freon removal)
- White Goods (stoves, hot water heaters)
- Fluorescent bulbs (>10 bulbs \$1.20/lb.)
- Gas grills and propane tanks (20 lb. only)
- Rigid Plastic Material (bins, crates, furniture)
- Scrap metal (any fabricated metal items)
- Tires, lead-acid vehicle batteries, battery jump packs, fenders, doors, bumpers, etc. (whole autos not accepted)

Construction and Demolition Debris

- Asphalt roofing shingles
- Asphalt, concrete, brick and block
- Siding (aluminum and vinyl)
- Gutters and downspouts
- Windows, doors and cabinets
- Sheet rock and wall board
- Flooring (carpet, tile, rugs, linoleum)
- Electrical wires (extension cords, holiday lights)
- Plumbing materials (pipes, sinks, tubs, toilets)
- Treated and untreated wood, pallets
- Railroad ties
- Fencing (wood and metal)
- Miscellaneous other materials
