Battery Recycling



<u>Never</u> throw rechargeable batteries (especially lithium-ion) <u>in the</u> <u>trash or curbside recycling bin!</u> The batteries can cause fires and harm the environment, people and property.

Bring used batteries to a collection center:

- <u>Alkaline batteries</u>: Bring to a Staples store or order your own recycling box from <u>www.Call2Recycle.org/store/</u>
- <u>Button cell batteries</u>: Tape or place in a plastic bag and bring to the next SCMUA Household Hazardous Waste Day.
- <u>Rechargeable batteries</u>: Including Lithium-ion. Find a drop-off location here: <u>www.Call2recycle.org/locator</u>. The SCMUA Recycling is a drop-off location for <300-watt hour batteries.
- <u>High energy batteries:</u> Find a drop-off location at <u>www.Call2recycle.org/locator</u> Rechargeable batteries >300 watt-hours may also be brought to the SCMUA Household Hazardous Waste events.
- <u>Car batteries (lead/acid)</u>: Bring to SCMUA Convenience Center. Scale charge applies.
- <u>E-Bike batteries:</u> Find a drop-off location for E-Bike batteries here: <u>www.Call2recycle.org/locator.</u>

NOTE: Tape the terminals or individually bag small batteries.

Businesses or government offices can contact *Call2Recycle* to obtain <u>free</u> dropoff boxes for collection and recycling of rechargeable batteries. To sign up online go to <u>http://www.call2recycle.org</u>.
